

9-MONTH CULTURAL DESIGN FELLOWSHIP

The fellowship is the deepest dive Springhouse offers, designed for adults ready to uproot their lives and immerse in the Springhouse model of creating regenerative culture. The fellowship consists of deep self-work, study of ecological and social design principles, and on-the-ground application of these principles in either the Vitality-Centered Education Track or the Regenerative Farm Design Track.

The Springhouse fellowship is an immersive program for adults who are:

- Interested in creating regenerative culture through authentic, place-based work
- Ready to commit to the journey of wholeness and personal development within the container of beloved community

FELLOWSHIP COMPONENTS

- **15 hours/week** in ONE of the two tracks
- **One-on-one mentoring** with a Springhouse staff member
- **Peer mentoring**
- **Vitality-Centered Design Lab**
- **Springhouse Permaculture course**
- **Weekly fellowship meetings**
- **One or more of Springhouse's soul-centered practices for adults**
 - These series and retreats offer an opportunity for adults to engage in practices that build their relationship with Soul and Mystery over time
 - Examples: Sacred Dance, Mindfulness, Yoga, and Embodied Writing
- **Weekly Well meetings** (if ready for shadow work)
 - Engage in shadow work where we get honest with ourselves in a group to build the courage and skills needed to authentically offer our gifts to the world

VITALITY-CENTERED EDUCATION TRACK

- Immerse in Springhouse's 7-12th grade program, a living example of vitality-centered education. Fellows will begin with participating in programming, and will eventually design and lead programming with the support of a Springhouse mentor.
- **Capstone project:** Design and implement a project that applies one or more of the 5 vitality-centered principles for the 7-12th grade program.

OR

REGENERATIVE FARM DESIGN TRACK

- The Springhouse campus was once a Chinese medicinal herb growing production, but the gardens have been dormant for years. Our goal is to revive the farm in the coming year as part of a community design process to ensure that our land can regenerate and meet our local community's needs. Fellows will participate in this process as well as take the first steps towards creating an operational farm.
- **Capstone project:** Design and implement a project that helps the land at Springhouse regenerate while meeting a community need.

Participants in the 2021-2022 founding fellowship will play a vital role in the creation of this program.

INVESTMENT

Upon acceptance, fellows will be invited to explore our investment packet to better determine what they can invest into the program with the guidance of Springhouse's Generative Development Lead.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, and the final deadline for the 2021-2022 fellowship is **August 15th**.

Springhouse does not provide lodging or employment, though Springhouse staff will direct fellows toward resources to secure affordable housing and employment, if necessary.

THE FELLOWSHIP IS A PROGRAM OF SPRINGHOUSE LOCATED IN FLOYD, VIRGINIA



Floyd County

Floyd County is situated on a high plateau in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Due to relatively high elevations, Floyd is at the top of its watershed, with no water flowing into the county. Water is carried out of the area by the Little River, eventually ending up in the Gulf of Mexico. The county spans 380 square miles of deciduous forest (much of which has been clearcut in the last 40 years), conventional and organic farmland, and a one-stoplight town. Floyd is home to 15,000 humans and an estimated 900,000 white-tailed deer, along with other creatures. It is politically divided and has a rich culture that centers around traditional Appalachian music. Artists, entrepreneurs, and homesteaders are drawn to the county due to its affordable land, vibrant community, and beautiful landscapes.

Springhouse

The 9-month fellowship is an emerging program of the existing Springhouse Community School located in Floyd County. Beginning with a 7th-12th grade day school over 7 years ago, Springhouse is actively reimagining the purpose and practice of education with the belief that learning is a lifelong journey that should be centered around vitality, meaning, and cultivating wholeness to better serve the world's emerging needs and build regenerative culture. Springhouse is networked nationally and internationally, sharing our educational design as well as continually learning from others who are working from the edges of education and culture change.
